<sup>1</sup>Men say that no translation can be a perfect reproduction of the original. However, God said that He will preserve His words from generation to generation and forever with nothing missing; and it will go forth into all countries of the world. Thus, His words must be with us today, intact and without error.

**So then, whom shall we believe? Men or what God said in Psalm 12:6-7 and Matthew 24:35?**

<sup>2</sup>Do we have with us today an English translation that is a perfect reproduction of the Hebrews and Greek text God gave that was passed down from generations to us? Do you know of any English Bible that is in full use today and can be found in just about every English speaking Christian home?

<sup>3</sup>Which Bible version was used during the great modern missionary movement that carried the Gospel all the way around the world by English speaking missionaries? Which Bible Christians gave their lives protecting many years ago? Which Bible was used to help establish laws, status, standards, etc., in England, America and the rest of the world? Which Bible has sold more copies than any other book to date for hundreds of years? Which version was used very late into the Nineteenth century that was believed and accepted as the common Bible at home, public schools, Government functions, Christian colleges and seminaries? The only Bible that qualifies in all of the above is the Authorized King James Version.

<sup>4</sup>The King James Version is the only English translation after 1611 that has greatly affected the lives and direction of millions of people since the English grammar was standardized for over four hundred years and there is no other English translation that did that. It is the only English translation that took out the apostate church causing a serious “deadly wound,” weakening its power grip from their “slaughtering Christians” campaign. (Read, “History of your English Bible,” in Chapter One of the downloadable book. Please note that the Beast in Revelation 13:14, received its “wound by a sword, **and did live**.” The sword is “the Word of God.” Ephesians 6:17).

<sup>5</sup>What do you think made the Authorized King James Version, so popular? God had to have given His stamp of approval with a powerful supernatural force behind the actual words of the text. (John 6:63) This book therefore became the greatest book that was ever printed. Can you image the intense grief placed on the devil because of this Holy book? Therefore, because he cannot destroy it (according to God’s promise) we are sure that Satan’s number one priority was to crush our faith in it.

<sup>6</sup>In today’s war, the most important thing (no-doubt the first thing) an army does to its enemy is to destroy the abilities of the enemy to communicate effectively with each other. It does not matter how large and powerful an army is, because if it never gets the order to attack, it is useless. The army would become blind, deaf and dumb because of no communication or no confidence in the communications. Can you imagine then how important it is for Satan to try and destroy God’s Word and man’s confidence in it?

<sup>7</sup>Satan is a master counterfeiter. Do you think he is going to design a Bible text battle plan that can easily be traced back to him? Do you think he is silly enough to use something that may not work? Satan uses the best resources available. Before you figure out what hit you, it will all be over and too late. The damage would have already been done. His plans will be so sophisticated until the only thing that will prevent us from being deceived is complete “BLIND FAITH” in the promises of God’s Word.

**Satan’s Missing Verses Strategy**

Satan intentionally included missing verses in his Bible to create long lasting “no-confident of doubt” in the preservation of God’s Word. If doubt is created with any ONE SINGLE verse in the scriptures, then the doctrine of the preservation of God’s Word will collapse. If Satan can maintain and sustain this no-confident perception in

the communication of God’s Word, then he has successfully accomplished his blind, deaf and dumb mission amongst Christian soldiers. Therefore, missing verses must **visually** remain in Satan’s Bible for future generations to assist in accomplishing his goals of Isaiah 14:13-14

<sup>8</sup>Remember what Matthew 24:24 and Mark 13:22 said? Look at what Satan will be capable of doing in Revelation chapter 13: he will deceive the whole world. Today, look at what he has achieved so far and many of us have accepted it: most scholars, preachers, teachers, etc., believe that no Bible versions are the perfect word of God.

<sup>9</sup>In our spiritual war, look at how Satan has most of us Christians thinking today: “Which text is closest to the originals?” “Which manuscripts are the most reliable?” “Do we have a perfect Bible in English today?” “We have the Bible but it isn’t in any one English version.” “Any version of the Bible is only the word of God where it has been correctly translated.” “Which English Bible has been correctly translated? Does one exist?” People also say that “the KJB is the best or nearest English translation to the original but it too has some errors.”

<sup>10</sup>Unfortunately and very sad, many pastors and ministers of the gospel today **publicly** claim that the Bible is the perfect word of God but in their private studies, among their pairs and in their hearts, they deny it. Satan therefore has successfully destroyed many Christians’ confidence in God’s Word.

<sup>11</sup>There are only two text families or sources where all of our Bible versions are coming from. The KJV came from one of these sources and all modern versions are coming from the other source. Have we ever taken notice? Isn’t it interesting and very strange that we do not have another English version with us today that is as **popular** and that is coming from the same Hebrew and Greek text and consulted sources used by the King James Version translators? If we do, then where is it? Look into the average home and see if it is there.

<sup>12</sup>Certainly, we have with us today, the Tyndale Bible, the Coverdale Bible, the Great Bible, the Matthew’s Bible, the Bishop Bible, etc., all coming from the underground Christian text; but where are they? If we look into the average English speaking Christian home, (no-doubt, most English speaking homes today) which Bible most likely would be found on the shelf? The answer is: a King James Version Bible. There are many other modern English versions that may be found all coming from another Hebrew and Greek source; however, they are filled with many missing verses, altered readings and erroneous footnotes claiming that not all verses are found in the earliest or oldest manuscripts.

God gave us ONE Bible in different languages around the world, but Satan gave us many Bibles. The Almighty gave us Himself as ONE God to worship, but Satan gave us many gods to worship. God usually sends an individual messenger to deliver His words, but Satan sends many conflicting messengers. (I King 18:19-22; II Chronicles 18:4-7: etc.)

<sup>13</sup>In a court of Law, verbal statements can scarcely be proven but, written words can. One of the most powerful evidence in a courtroom is physical or real evidence. Physical or real evidence is much more powerful than eyewitness or spoken evidence. Thus, when God decided to put His words in writing, He made an irreversible decision. **We can hold God to His Word in the courtroom of His presence.** Once those words have been written, they are irrevocable. God must love us and truly desire for us to have His words and to be sure of them by putting them in written form. Psalms 138:2 says: “for thou hast magnified thy Word above thy name.”

<sup>14</sup>Now! Do you think God would give His original words only to those early writers then lost them many years later? Do you think He would allow His words to be corrupt with heretical teachings and then write them in a language that only few can speak and translate into

other languages? (Remember the gift of tongues in the book of Acts? Many Christians spoke several different languages FLUENTLY.)

<sup>15</sup>What if those original words written by the authors were the only perfect words God gave to us but are now passed off the scene? What if it was impossible for us today to ever obtain those original words? Why then would God inspire His original words (or write a perfect book) and then allow it to be lost or allow it to later be filled with mistakes, false teachings, counterfeit passages and doubtful readings? He is "too!" powerful to allow this to happen. God can just speak and His words survive from beginning until the end of time, intact and without error. Therefore, this is not consistent with God's nature. What good is there with inspiring a book that is not preserved free from error through history? In fact, to inspire His Word perfect in the originals and then lose it somewhere in history would have been a waste of God's time. **How can we then hold God to His words if He allowed them to get lost hundreds of years ago?**

<sup>16</sup>This would be like an untrustworthy or an unfaithful business partner allowing forgery, changing a legal contract or intentionally allowing the contract to get lost or be destroyed because of greed, deceit, selfishness or unfaithfulness. The partners would no longer have any written contractual evidence with binding agreements. Thus, neither partner can be held liable for breach of contractual agreements in a court of law. (Do you think this same type of breach will surface in God's courtroom?) This is not God's character (or attribute). He is not afraid of us holding Him to His written words; therefore, why should He allow them to get lost?

**Do you know if God allowed His Word (or any part of it that He truly said and meant) to get lost through hundreds of years of copying and the translation process, He would not be faithful. This act of allowing His Word to get lost would be an INTENTIONAL act of unfaithfulness because of who He is and His great and mighty powers: the power to keep it preserved throughout history just by simply speaking it. (John 12:48) Think about it: we cannot be held accountable to it, if it (or any part of it) got lost. We would then be able to present strong arguments in our defense in the courtroom of God's presence for what is and was not found in all Bible versions including those that point to Satan as God.**

<sup>17</sup>If you do not **believe** God preserved His words for us today, what this really and truly implies is that He cannot and did not do what He said He will do with them. This mindset is very dangerous because scripture verses prove that He said He **will preserve all of them**. Look at the simple mistake Moses made that caused him a very painful loss in Numbers 20:12. Notice carefully what the LORD said unto Moses and Aaron: "...Because ye **believed** me not, to sanctify me in the eyes of the children of Israel, therefore ye shall not bring this congregation into the land which I have given them." In-other-words, because Moses did not **believe** God's specific instruction (Numbers 20:7-8), and **for this reason**, he did not sanctify (glorify, proclaim or preached) God's unadulterated and perfect Word among the people (because of his unbelief), he lost one of the greatest blessings all Israel looked forward to receiving at the time: this was entering into the Promised Land. This is a very serious warning lesson for us today no matter where you are spiritually; that is, God is no respecter of persons. We all know the conclusion of this story: even though Moses unsuccessfully begged God to reconsider His judgment, he paid dearly for his error; the error and sin of **unbelief**. (Rom. 14:23, Heb. 10:38, 11:6)

<sup>18</sup>Psalms 12:6-7 says: "The words of the LORD are pure words...Thou shalt keep them, O LORD, thou shalt preserve them from this generation for ever." Psalm 100:5 says: "...his truth endureth to all generations." Jesus Christ said in Matthew 24:35, "Heaven and earth shall pass away, but my words shall not pass away." Jeremiah 32:17 and 27 says: "Ah Lord GOD! Behold, thou hast made the heaven and the earth by thy great power and stretched out arm, and there is

nothing too hard for thee." Should we then believe God or men? If Jesus Christ said what He did in Matthew 24:35, strengthening Psalm 12:7, **then God's Word must be here with us today within our reach.**

**The conclusion of the matter really is that God has wasted His time if He did not preserve ALL of His inspired words for us today as He promised He would. Also, to believe that He did waste His time because we do not have ALL of His words with us today is FOOLISH!**

<sup>19</sup>This writer is truly convinced from investigations of historical evidence, scientific evidence and logical conclusions mentioned in the downloadable book that the Hebrew and Greek text used by the King James Version translators from the underground Christian Bible was passed down to us over hundreds of years by God. Therefore, the question really is: do we have a perfect reproduction of this Hebrew and Greek text into the English?

<sup>20</sup>The English of the King James Bible was in its purest form in 1611. Psalm 12:6 says: "The words of the Lord are pure words;" not the degenerated vocabulary of today. God is a God of purity and everything about Him is pure. Therefore, if He wanted to use a tool that would be the vehicle to carry His words to the world; it too must be pure. God also knew that in a few hundred years after 1611, that English would be the universal language of the world. Today, we see that in every discipline around the world, if you don't speak English you will not get very far with becoming an international success. This is seen prevalent even in the business world: in China and all Asia, in Russia, in India, in Europe, in Middle Eastern countries, in Africa, etc., English is dominating all the languages of the world. Thus, the English of the King James Bible is known to be the finest form of the English language ever used.

<sup>21</sup>There are persons who question why the translators not used the word "**temple**" (which is "rightly" translated from the Greek) but instead used the English word "**church**" (Acts 19:37); why not use the word "**Passover**" (which is also "rightly" translated from the Greek) but instead used the English word "**Easter**" (Acts 12:4). In addition, why did the translators used "Baptism" for "immersion," "schoolmaster" for "attendant," "sweet savour" for "soothing aroma," "God save the king" for "May the king live," and "God forbid" for "may it not be?"

<sup>22</sup>Dishonest Bible scholars claim that the Greek word cannot be translated two different ways as seen in the KJV. They make this claim ONLY when it occurs in the KJV. However, these same critics are very silent when modern versions do the very same thing. They create their prejudice and jealous standards of "correcting" the KJV but will not apply the very same rules and standards when it shows up in modern versions. For example, using the same Greek word in the NASV, "fall away" in Matt 26:31 is changed to "stumble" in I Cor. 8:13; "Sky" in Act 1:10 changed to "heaven" in II Cor. 12:2 and so on.

<sup>23</sup>Can anyone explain God's Sovereignty? Can anyone explain how "an evil spirit from the LORD" came and afflicted King Saul? (I Samuel 16:14) Can anyone explain how God authorized a spirit to go and lie "in the mouth of" all of Ahab's prophets. (...the LORD hath put a lying spirit in the mouth of these thy prophets, and the LORD hath spoken evil against thee." II Chronicles 18:22) Can anyone explain how it is with God that because He was angry at Israel, "he moved David against them to say, Go, number Israel and Judah." (II Samuel 24:1) But, "...Satan stood up against Israel, and provoked David to number Israel." (I Chronicles 21:1) Israel was severely punished. Seventy thousand men died. Satan no-doubt did not know that he was being used to carry out God's wishes. Can anyone explain God's all-knowingness? When King Solomon's heart turned away from Him and he began worshiping idols, God had already stirred up adversaries towards King Solomon long before he became the King. (I King 11:14-40). For King Solomon's punishment, the nation of Israel was divided in two. (Our God is so powerful, He can clearly hear and see "infinitely well" into the future.)

<sup>24</sup>Supposing when you stand before God, He says to you: **"I selected those words in the English, not the KJV translators because they truly say what I mean and mean what I say!"** Do you think that would be the time to use words like "but," "how," "why," "when," etc? God said in Proverbs 3:5, "Trust in the LORD with all thine heart and lean not unto thine own understanding." Another way of saying this is: lean not unto thine own knowledge, skills, thoughts, learning, teachings, discoveries, findings, research or analytical views; just trust God and His Word!

<sup>25</sup>No one has all the answers for Bible questions. To have all the correct answers for Bible questions we would then be God. Secondly, if we got all of our questions answered, we would then walk by sight and not by faith. (Hebrews 11:6, II Corinthians 5:7) We will not have any need to take a leap of faith including the belief in God who we have never seen. Our Christian faith is not built on things that are carnal or that can be seen and explained. It is built on blind faith. As Dr. Samuel C. Gipp, author of "The Answer Book," page 157, puts it: God would rather we have faith in Him in the face of the unexplainable, as so many of the Old and New Testament saints have exhibited, than to have faith in our own human ability to "find an answer" concerning every difficult passages.

<sup>26</sup>Somehow, it appears that we humans corrupt ourselves quicker when we live and walk by sight instead of blind faith. For proof of this, look at what the children of Israel did. After coming out of Egypt walking through the wilderness and actually **seeing** God's mighty power at work, they greatly corrupted themselves **many times** by sinning against God and having a serious lack of faith in Him.

<sup>27</sup>Just like how we have never seen God, but yet we believe in Him because of all the visible evidence in His creation and we accept books that were written of Him:

**So then, why can't we believe and accept as facts that the King James Version is an accurate English translation of the inspired, infallible text God wanted us to have?**

<sup>28</sup>**This belief must be accepted by faith.** Remember what doubting Thomas said, "Except I shall see in his hands the print of the nails, and put my finger into the print of the nails, and thrust my hand into his side, I will not believe." (John 20:25) KJV critics in essence say the same thing: that if we cannot see, explain, handle or touch the originals (the Word of God), then we will not believe that His words are alive and very much preserved today. (Keep in mind that Jesus Christ is the Word - John 1:1, 10, 14). Jesus Christ is still saying today, "be not faithless, but believing...blessed are they that have not seen, and yet have believed."

<sup>29</sup>Do not be like doubting Thomas! If the KJV is not God's preserved text (intact and without error) then it is up to you the reader to find the book that God was talking about in Psalm 12:6,7 and what Jesus Christ was talking about in Matthew 24:35. This is because it must be within our reach or with us today according to God's Word.

<sup>30</sup>Imagine standing before God and the King James Version Bible **appears** before you (Jesus Christ is the Word) and say, "Reach hither thy finger, and behold my hands; and reach hither thy hand, and thrust it into my side...because thou hast seen me, thou hast believed..." (John 20:27, 29)

<sup>31</sup>Finally, men just love correcting God's grammar; even our very own Christian brothers and sisters who follow the natural ways of the world. Read what Paul had to say about God methods of speaking to us in I Corinthians 1:18-31 to 2:1-16. Does God use incorrect or poor grammar to convey a message or thought in His Word? God can and does anything He pleases. Modern-day scholars and grammarians, using their "learnt-in-the-classroom" skills, change and modify words and verses in the Bible, to convey how they want or believe the text should read. **(They will all one day answer for this in the courtroom of**

## God's Holy presence.)

<sup>32</sup>**Remember** what Satan did in Genesis 3:4: he changed ("corrected") what God said by adding the word **"not"** to God's instructions in Genesis 2:17 ("thou shalt surely die" changed to "ye shall **NOT** surely die").

<sup>33</sup>In Acts 4:13 the disciples language grammar and speech was not proper among the scholarly elites even though they spoke under the power and influence of the Holy Spirit. They spoke a common and simple language and were despised by the elders of the people who heard and read nothing except it was polished and eloquent. They recognized them as **unlearned men** because of their "bad" grammar. Remember what Jesus said in Mark 13:11; Luke 21:12-15? One of the reasons why today men hate the Written Word without a cause like they did with the Living Word, ("...despised and rejected of men..." in Is. 53:3) is because of the written language God used. This reason is also without a cause.

<sup>34</sup>**Always keep in mind** the methods God use to get our attention and speak to us: He uses many times the "low and smelly stable" approach to communicate with us, a method that can only be discerned and received by humble hearts filled with faith. (Matthew 5:3-12) To illustrate this: Sometimes He sends us a despised and smelly beggar (perhaps an angel in disguised) to communicate (spoken broken English) or get our attention; but, we many times do not or can not discern this because of our very own self-learnt pride.

<sup>35</sup>In conclusion, knowing that **[a]** The King James Version is a very accurate, word for word, translation from the Hebrew and Greek source passed down to us from God. (Read "Translation Techniques And The \$25,000,000.00 Question" from the downloadable book.) **[b]** There is no other English translation from the same Hebrew and Greek sources used by the KJV translators with us today, that can be found in just about every English speaking Christian home. **[c]** The English of the King James Bible is in its purest form and Psalm 12:6 says: "The word of the LORD are pure words." **[d]** God **promised** that He would preserve His Word throughout all generations and forever. **All of the modern versions including the NKJV, deny the preservation of God's Words. [e]** God is **"All-Powerful!"** and nothing is too hard for Him. His power can preserve anything. He spoke things into existence (like the heavens, the earth, water, humans, etc.) and we are still here, today. Let us then "walk by faith, not by sight." (II Corinthians 5:7)

Can you imagine standing before God and showing Him an "error" or a grammar problem you have found in the text He promised to preserved; then hear Him say: "There are no errors in my Word; I purposely placed that word and structured that sentence like that so that I can test your faith in my Word and me; you have FAILED that test!" Let us be careful when attacking God's Word because we may discover later that we were really attacking God. Remember, the Word is who in John 1:1

<sup>36</sup>If our salvation is solely based on faith alone in God's Word, shouldn't we have the same faith in God that He will do what He said He will do with His Word? After all, the Scripture says: "Whatsoever is not of faith is sin;" (Rom. 14:23) "...without faith it is impossible to please him" (Heb. 11:6) and, "The just shall live by faith" (Heb. 10:38).

Please note that this author is not suggesting that the King James Version is the ONLY text God preserved. What is meant here is that even though God used other languages to preserve and carry His Word to the people, the KJV is the "vehicle" God used to carry His Word to English speaking nations. Thus, His Word can be found intact and without error in many other languages of the world (French, Italian, Spanish, German, etc.).
